What's in a Name?

Greetings this Easter season. We have journeyed through Lent and Holy Week to the Cross where at the empty tomb we recall Jesus' words to his faithful follower.

He simply says her name; 'Mary!'

Here we have moved from a general narration of what happened on that first day of the week, how the disciples had discovered the empty tomb - the stone rolled away... the linen wrappings... the disciples returning to their homes.

Then... Mary's story. We become witnesses to the deep grief and suffering of another, as she weeps outside the tomb. The despair and confusion of not knowing. It is in the midst of this Jesus appears.

Our attention is drawn to this intimate scene and nothing else matters but these two characters. She mistakes Jesus for the gardener at first until he says her name... 'Mary'.

How powerful is the use of a name.

How intimate it is to be known by name... not just a throw away sentence, not a shallow means of identification but a deep knowing of what our name signifies. "What is in a name?" asks Shakespeare. "A rose by any other name would smell as sweet."

Maybe so... but a name as we know it, holds so much. It holds memory and we can learn and be inspired by the names of others... their lives, their faith... their love... and in turn live differently.

When Jesus says "Mary", she is known. This deep knowing, this encounter with Jesus, changes her. She moves from weeping and confusion at the tomb back into the world... sharing with others the news that she has seen the Lord.

We can easily keep this Resurrection story general and on the level of a 'happily ever after' tale, where the good guy triumphs over the odds in the end and all is well with the world... it is a great story after all.

But, what will really change us, and in turn, change the world, is when we allow ourselves to hear our names being called by the risen Jesus... who knows us to the very core... who comes to us in our grief and confusion.

When we are changed by this knowing, our eyes can turn back to the world, where we too can share ourselves and our stories with others... understanding grief and pain, but also the hope that comes from being known by Jesus, who understood, took into himself the weight of a dark sinful world on the cross and who defeated death through this loving act.

So, what a celebration... this Easter season we move from darkness and weeping to light and rejoicing... from death to life. The God who knows us by name was dead but is now alive.

Christ is risen! Alleluia, alleluia!

He is risen indeed. Alleluia, alleluia!
