These lines, the first first half-verse of a poem by e.e.cummings, feel like an expression of Autumn. Everything that has grown up during the Summer is being tossed about by unruly forces, and the only rule seems to be that the rules are changing. Interpretations of the poem vary: some focus on the excitement of the poem's pace, others on some of the darker imagery, and others on the hints of optimism at the end of each verse.

The first verse ends with the line 'the single secret will still be man'. It could simply mean that human beings are the key to the force that blows 'king to beggar', 'hope to terror', and 'soon to never', or it could hint at hidden depths in human nature. The vital question will always be, 'What lies in those hidden depths?' A number of answers are suggested by the sciences that investigate human behaviour, but Christian Faith insists that the single secret in human beings is the image of God. Perhaps there is hope for the world after all.
