Launch of SEC 'Enable' Grants

The Church in Society Committee of the Scottish Episcopal Church has relaunched its grant funding scheme to support projects which work to enable life in all its fulness for children, young people and their families.

The Enable Grant, which was previously known as the Child Poverty Grant, can be used to access up to £5000 in any one year. The Church in Society Committee is interested in funding a wide range of initiatives and there are no prescribed types of project.

As long as the group seeking support has a connection to an SEC congregation and is meeting a real need in that congregation's community (expecting to impact on the lives of children, young people and their families), the application will be considered.

All applications should be made using the approved Enable Grant Application Form. Specially designed for Brechin by the Embroidery Workshop of Derby Cathedral, they are inspired by the Tay, with ornamental hoods each slightly different to reflect the different moods of the river: morning and evening, ebb and flood, winter and summer.
