The news was full of the severe flooding in the city of Brechin itself with many people displaced from their homes by the river South Esk and other homes and businesses were flooded throughout Tayside, Angus and Aberdeenshire.

<u>Provincial Building Grants: Timescales</u> for Additional Applications

The SEC Provincial Building Grants Group still has a balance of about £91,500 available to award. The Group agreed to schedule an additional meeting in December on Tuesday 12th December to allocate funds against projects. Applications have to have been approved by the Diocese, so a submission deadline of 11th November to the Diocese is suggested to let Council review and approve. Note: the usual requirements apply: three quotes required, up to 50% of the cost of the work, ideally the work identified in a quinquennial report. Contact the office for more information. https://
