Diocesan Autumn Synod: Being a “Healthy Church”

Diocesan Autumn Synod took place last Saturday (28th October) in St Ninian's Dundee. Budgets and quota were set for next year, the annual report and accounts for 2021-22 were received. Revised cathedral statutes were amended prior to seeking Episcopal Synod approval next month. Mike Duncan retired as Diocesan Secretary after about nine years' service, with the heartfelt thanks of Synod.

Bishop Andrew presented the next development of the Brechin Diocesan strategy: “Being a Healthy Church”. Provost Elizabeth led an exercise aimed at prompting conversations about what a healthy church is. Faced with a long list of resources a church might have, everything from hymnbooks to bishops, they were asked to choose the five they thought were most essential.

Elizabeth writes: This is an exercise with no right answers. Churches are like people – they need different things at different times, and health is different for everyone. So there were lots of different answers and plenty of vigorous discussion. But some ideas came up a lot in different groups around the room:

- Nearly everyone voted for coffee – or some kind of hospitality.
- There was a lot of focus on leadership and how it should be (trained, collaborative).
- Community links, awareness of the local context of the church, and outreach projects emerged really strongly as something people were thinking about.
- Nobody voted for hymnbooks as something vital, and generally there wasn't a lot of emphasis on keeping everything as it always has been.
- There was a lot of energy, in the discussions and in the ideas as well – people talked about action and the need for action and mission.
- People talked a lot about vocation – it was on the list of resources. ‘It's not about institutional survival, it's not about keeping the show on the road’. They spoke about finding what their church was called to be, here and now.

Some groups clustered similar resources together, and noticed that the clusters were a good match with the marks of a healthy church: energised by faith rather than just keeping things going, looking outward, trying to discern what God's calling it to be, willing to change, operating as a community, making room for everyone, doing a few things and doing them well. (The list is from Robert Warren's “The Healthy Churches' Handbook”).

New Diocesan Officers Appointed at Brechin Diocesan Synod

Two new officers were appointed for Brechin Diocese at the Synod. **Dr Jaap Jacobs** was appointed as **Diocesan Secretary** on the retirement of Mike Duncan. Jaap has been acting as Assistant Diocesan Secretary since the spring. With the appointment of Kenneth Gibson as Dean in the summer, a vacancy had arisen for the post of **Synod Clerk**, a Chapter Canon elected by the clergy of the diocese. **Rev Jim Benton-Evans** was elected to this post and is now a Canon of the Chapter, to be installed at a future date. Thanks to Dr Jacobs and Canon Benton-Evans as they begin these new roles in the Diocese.

Provincial Building Grants: Timescales for Additional Applications

The SEC Provincial Building Grants Group still has a balance of about £91,500 available to award. The Group agreed to schedule an additional meeting in December on Tuesday 12th December to allocate funds against projects. Applications have to have been approved by the Diocese, so a submission deadline of 11th November to the Diocese is suggested to let Council review and approve. Note: the usual requirements apply: three quotes required, up to 50% of the cost of the work, ideally the work identified in a quinquennial report.
