Two Deans and a Chancellor are Safely Installed in St Paul's Cathedral Dundee

The Installation of the new Dean of Brechin, the Chancellor of Brechin Diocese and a Dean Emeritus of Brechin took place at a Choral Evensong at St Paul's Cathedral, Dundee on Sunday 27th August.

The service was a wonderful celebration of ministry as Kenneth Gibson, priest at St Mary Magdalene and Synod Clerk was installed as Dean. The retiring Dean, Fay Lamont, was installed as Dean Emeritus and Sheriff George Way of Plean was officially installed as Chancellor, the legal advisor to the bishop. George started his role in lockdown in 2020, so an official installation was well overdue.

As well as being installed by Provost Elizabeth, each of the new ministers was given a 'Communion Forest' presentation of a certificate and map of a tree planted on their behalf by the Woodland Trust and some 'pollinator bombs' to plant for themselves. The service was a great occasion well organised by Provost Elizabeth and Pastoral Musician at the cathedral Stuart Muir. The new 'Tay Copes' were also worn by the members of Chapter present and the new Dean Emeritus. The Deans of Glasgow and Galloway and St Andrews, Dunkeld and Dunblane also attended as special guests. It was a wonderful musical occasion giving thanks for service and new beginnings.

Anglican Communion Forest

All church communities are encouraged to find opportunities to plant trees to mark important occasions in their lives as part of a global project for sustainability and environmental renewal.

The Companionship link between Brechin, Iowa and Eswatini is also being marked with the planting of trees as part of the Communion Forest. A Yew tree was planted in August 2022 by Bishops Betsey (Iowa), Dalcy (Eswatini) and Andrew (Brechin) during the post-Lambeth visit to Brechin. A Burr Oak, the native tree of Iowa, was planted by the Bishops and pilgrims earlier this month in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Watch this space for a tree planting in Eswatini in the future!
