Her funeral will take place at Holy Rood, Carnoustie on 16th August at 10.45am with committal at the Friockheim crematorium at 12.30 pm.

A garden area which had been used as an allotment but had become overgrown has become a new garden space for the group to use. Grants were found for a skip, shed, tools and water butts. Plants and
