#### **Professor Ann Loades CBE: RIP**

Ann Loades, Honorary Professor at St Andrews and Professor Emerita at Durham and a member of the cathedral in Dundee died on Tuesday. She became unwell while returning from church on Sunday and did not recover. Ann was one of 20th and 21st-century British theology's great figures, the first woman to receive a personal chair at the University of Durham and the second person ever to be honoured with a CBE for services to theology. We will share details of funeral and memorial services once these are planned. Please keep all of her friends and family in your prayers.

#### 'Anglican' Christianity: An Advent webinar series from the Scottish Episcopal Institute

Over 40 Churches around the globe, consisting of no less than 85 million people, identify themselves as 'Anglican'. Yet, Anglicans are divided among themselves in terms of doctrine and practice as was demonstrated in the most recent Lambeth Conference held in Summer 2022.



This Series looks to four staples that Anglicans have classically identified as the bases of their doctrine and practice to highlight harmony rather than discord. The SEI Advent series will be offered on the Mondays of Advent 2022 from 7pm to 7.30pm (GMT) in 30-minute webinars, each of which will be posted on the Scottish Episcopal Church YouTube channel. Presented by Revd Dr Michael Hull, SEI Director of Studies and Tutor, the series is meant to be a resource for Anglicans (Episcopalians) to use creatively during the Season of Advent, for example as a refresher course for individuals or a conversation starter for church groups, with discussion questions at the end of each webinar.

Various projects and other initiatives are taking place in churches in the Diocese. These include:

#### St Luke's Foodbank/Clothing Bank/Café

Since the start of the pandemic "lockdowns", St Luke's has operated the above. It has settled into a fixed pattern of opening 1000-1500 on Tuesdays and Wednesdays providing food, clothing, warmth and companionship.

Around 20 to 25 food parcels are provided daily and the café is busy with locals dropping in and Foodbank visitors taking advantage of the cakes and toasties provided at next to cost prices. It's a very happy and cosy place to be and number of nonchurch volunteers help out regularly. Encouragingly, there is modest growth in church worship taking place, as those attending find out first-hand what the church is all about.

If you happen to get an offer of food or clothing (sorry, can only accommodate clothing for adults) and are looking for somewhere to direct it, please consider St. Luke's if you can.

There is a reception shed in the car park outside the hall which is signposted, and permanently unlocked, where items can be safely lodged. It's checked regularly.

Food stocks have been going down as need has increased – and it is anticipated that the winter energy crisis will result in even greater attendance at the Café for warmth and for food parcels.

#### Warm Spaces/Cosy Spaces: Maps
