## LIFE & FAITH IN LENT

**Lent is a time to stop and consider what is really important in life. So I hope that you are keeping a good Lent. People can be quite imaginative - I have heard of someone who is giving up Facebook for Lent and a family who are taking on 40 Good Deeds between them.**

In addition to supporting Arbroath & Auchmithie, Stonehaven and Muchalls during their vacancies, this year I am trying to be out and about meeting some new people in fresh ways. The questioning year 6 children of Clepington Primary School Dundee certainly kept me on my toes recently! Next up are two *Saints & Sinners - Meet the Bishop* evenings in pubs: The Old Brewhouse Arbroath on Thursday 5 March (I'm practising pulling pints - see photo) and the Downfield Hotel Dundee on 12 March, both 7pm. I will be interviewed by Craig Dowling and Kerry Dixon, about life and faith, there will be questions, discussion, live music and food.



On Mothering Sunday I am preaching at St Andrew' Roman Catholic Cathedral Dundee, with Bishop Stephen Robson presiding. I am delighted that the Steeple Church and our Cathedral are also enjoying reciprocal ecumenical visits in the city during Lent. On Saturday 21 March I am looking forward to a Late Night Out at Pubs & Clubs with the Dundee Street Pastors, with a Confirmation at Holy Rood Carnoustie the following morning. On Tuesday 24 March I will join the volunteers serving customers at the Rainbow Charity Shop run by St Andrew's Brechin. People may be uncertain or even wary of traditional church services but as Christians in our everyday conversations we can engage with human dilemmas that affect everyone and will find that spiritual curiosity is alive and well.

**Diocesan Synod takes place on Saturday 7 March 9.30am - 3.30pm in Chalmers Ardler Church Dundee. As well as those clergy and lay representatives required to attend, we would welcome all in the diocese. In addition to the annual reporting and financial business there will be key discussions about diocesan vision and governance, about our Companion Diocesan links, ministry formation and the care of the elderly.
