### FROM THE BISHOP'S MARCH DIARY

### **KNOWING OUR LIMITATIONS**

The news that Pope Benedict XVI is to retire casts an intriguing shadow over Christians worldwide, observing of the season of Lent. His sudden abdication attributed to failing stamina has been variously described as courageous and a surprise but not a shock. It is certainly a rare event in the history of the papacy. As his time as Pope is evaluated for some Benedict is seen as a great theologian but a poor leader – so perhaps his decision to retire gracefully will yet prove to be his leadership legacy. As Clint Eastwood famously said on screen in Magnum Force: 'a man's got to know his limitations.'

Understanding our frailties and limitations, and living with and beyond them, is the Lenten journey with Jesus, the road of the passion. As the liturgy signposts us: 'by carefully keeping these days, Christians take to heart the call to repentance and the assurance of forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel, and so to grow in faith and in devotion to our Lord.' And there is no shortage of ways to pray and ponder, to retreat or participate – in quiet reading or lively discussion groups or in active service of others. Each of has a unique and precious *interior life* which is nourished differently just as our personalities are different.

And yes, there are things to give up, those excesses and distractions which we can name if we are honest. A recent YouGov survey found that four per cent of those planning to give up something for Lent had chosen alcohol. In response, the Church Times ran a feature on alcohol, describing it as many churchgoers' recreational drug of choice. Like many things in life there are beneficial and disastrous possibilities in many of our choices. Overleaf you can see some reminders of the wider dimensions of fasting - of world hunger and the carbon footprint.

The important thing is to humbly acknowledge our need to grow as people of God and to see Lent as a Spring-time opportunity rather than a bleak burden. As the Iona Community's 'Hymn of the Passion' sums it all up: Lord, in mercy, pardon send me. Lord, from my worst self defend me. By your broken body mend me. Hear my prayer and here am I.
