St Luke's New Approach to Worship

At St Luke's Downfield we have started to try to run Church for those who don't like Church and don't come! These things might seem mutually exclusive (impossible, even?!) but nevertheless 'Café Church' has begun.

So the church building has now been set up as a café, with music and singing playing in the background, and the gathering starts with coffee, croissants and the Sunday papers. The format of Café Church is still evolving but, with the Bishop's permission we are beginning to experiment to try to make Church more accessible to people who may never have experienced it before.

We have therefore created a modern interpretation of the liturgy in the contemporary grammar and language that we use today, for people with no church background to understand.

The sermon has been replaced with an audio visual presentation and discussion. Everything is projected onto screens and we use no books. People are invited to feel at home and help themselves to coffee at any time during the gathering.

The Eucharist uses projected images that tell the story of the Last Supper and is also shared café style. The people who are gathered are encouraged to reflect that, 'may we who have shared the Jesus bread live like Jesus, and may we who drank the Jesus wine bring the life of Jesus to other people'.

All that is happening at St Luke's is in its very early stages – and while we are also trying to refurbish the building! – but as a congregation we are excited by what God is doing and are already welcoming some new faces to our weekly meetings. If anyone is interested in what we are doing, or would like to come along, then please get in touch!
