# St Paul's Cathedral, Dundee Celebrates

160 years since the present building was dedicated and opened for worship

150 years since its consecration

110 years since St Paul's became the Cathedral Church  
of the Diocese of Brechin.

## WHAT'S HAPPENING!

This year marks several important anniversaries in the life of our Cathedral, the mother church of the Diocese – at the end of October we shall celebrate 160 years since the present building was dedicated and opened for worship. We also celebrate 150 years since its consecration (the rule of the church was that no new church could be consecrated with debt and it took ten years to pay it off!) And as if all that was not enough, we are celebrating 110 years since St Paul's became the Cathedral church (ie containing the Bishop's seat) of the Diocese of Brechin.

There are, therefore, as you would expect, lots of things happening. Please try and put as many of them into your diaries as possible and invite your friends too! The only one that needs advance ticket purchase is the Ceilidh being held on the evening of Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> October in the Bonar Hall on Perth Road. This is limited to 150 people due to the space available and a third of the tickets are already sold!
