CHOOSING OUR NEXT BISHOP

It's begun! The process for electing the next Bishop of Brechin is officially underway. Over the last few weeks, I've been asked what's involved, who will choose and how long it will take. So here's the quick Cooks tour of the process.

The Process

First of all, the Diocesan Council appoints a small group of its members to produce a Diocesan Profile describing the diocese and offering ideas about the kind of bishop it believes we should be looking for. This stage has already been completed following input from members of Diocesan Synod. The Profile will be available on the diocesan website early in September.

Then the Primus calls together the Synod (now renamed the Electoral Synod). This is the chance for members to make their views known and is due to take place on September 2nd.

Between September and December, a search committee known as the Preparatory Committee will receive nominations for the post and draw up a shortlist of candidates. This committee is chaired by the Primus and comprises representatives from the diocese and the wider Province. The shortlist will be made public once completed.

Long but Thorough

The decisive stage happens in February. Synod will meet the candidates and hear them speak about their experience and their vision. One week later, the Synod will reconvene and cast its votes. No white smoke, but hopefully a clear discernment of whom God is calling as the 51st Bishop of Brechin!

Finally, if all goes according to plan, the Bishop will be installed in St Paul's Cathedral in May. A lengthy process, to be sure but reassuringly thorough.

I ask your prayers for wisdom and discernment for all involved.
