# Frivolities of The Past

- *Bishop John*

**Over fifty years ago when Dundee's original medieval Overgate (the one demolished by the municipal bulldozer in the 60s) still stood, it was the centre of the City's Hogmanay Celebrations. My parents took us down once, late on New Year's Eve. I can still remember the colourful stalls, people dancing and laughing in the lanes, and something you didn't see very often—six foot bobbies walking in pairs. They weren't taking no chances!**

**This colourful riotous street wasn't unusual in Scottish towns in the 50s or early 60s and is, perhaps, mirrored today in the colourful events in Edinburgh's Princes Street. At the same time, the practice of 'first footing' was commonplace, when families visited their friends and neighbours. The practice may be less popular now.**

**I've sometimes thought that the wild Scottish New Year celebrations were a reaction to the Presbyterian determination that Christmas should not be celebrated at all, though that 'prohibition' was itself dropped in the 50s and 60s when churches began to hold watch-night services at Christmas and New Year.**

**Whatever the reason, I've always rather liked New Year nonsense. It seems to me that so often people genuinely want the best for their family and friends and hope and pray for a better year.**

**In the world we now face, with recession, war abroad, and with unemployment rising again—especially in our Diocese, the incarnation means we must work with all things human. We must embrace what we can, trusting that God works in us for the good, and that the seasonal good wishes offered by friends and neighbours, even in sometimes riotous celebrations, are truly meant and received**
