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A Leap of Faith

First, a Happy New Year to all Bulletin readers. I hope the family and holiday season was enjoyable, and that your resolutions are intact and your hopes are still alive for the unfolding year.

At the Vestries Training Day at Brechin last November I said that my hope was for the Diocese of Brechin 'to be the most improved diocese in the Scottish Episcopal Church in 2012'. The scribe wrote 'best diocese' on the flip-chart! However I was careful to say *improved* because I believe this is do-able across our churches – each charge should be growing the congregation numerically and spiritually, and looking for fresh ways to be an outward-facing Church. For example, getting involved with a local school or a community issue. Even by small steps continuous improvement is energising and self-reinforcing.

So we cannot always wait for people to join us nowadays, we need rather to find them where they are. This requires a degree of risk-taking, road-testing of new things and nerve-holding not always congenial to churches, to clergy and congregations.

Therefore during 2012, in addition to the usual round of church festivals and services, I would particularly welcome invitations to public events around the diocese where our church is contributing something interesting. I have some ideas that I can undertake as Bishop in the city and region and I am working on our media profile but the best ideas are usually quite local.

2012 is a Leap Year so such a Leap of Faith approach seems appropriate. It is also an Olympic Year centred much on London and its new stadiums. The UK Christian focus on the Games is entitled 'More than Gold' (1 Peter 1.7) reminding us that 'going for gold' is not just about winning gold medals and celebrity status but about each Christian aspiring to the gold standard of living a genuine and faithful life. The long jump has a long run-up to achieve lift-off and athletes and Christian disciples certainly need to prepare well for life's races.

Reaching the gold standard and becoming the best may take us in Brechin Diocese a bit longer.... but until then why not at least aim to have an item at your Annual Meeting later this year where you honestly report on 'How we grew in the past year.' I will certainly be asking myself that same question.

MESSAGES FROM THE ADMINISTRATION BOARD

The information below has been circulated to all Vestry Secretaries who have been requested to pass it on to their Priest/Treasurer/Vestry members.

1 Applications for Building Grants and Loans are available from the Diocesan Treasurer. Closing dates for application forms for 2012 are: 21 Feb., 24 April, 17 July, 11 Sept., 6 Nov. and 25 Dec.

2 Allchurches Small Grant Scheme application forms are available from the Diocesan Secretary. There is still some money available. Application may be made towards the cost of helping churches engage with their communities in mission and outreach. All projects must be linked to the church's Mission Strategy. They may be used for equipment or other resources and/or used towards buildings to help in engaging with the community.

3 Dunderdale Fund for the Endowment of Charges application forms are available from the Diocesan Treasurer. Closing date for submission is 29 February. Application may be made towards the cost of helping churches engage with their communities in mission and outreach. Grants will be paid in the form of a single payment. All proposed projects must be linked to the church's Mission Strategy. They may be used to develop work with children and young people; facilitate new forms of worship; support social action; help with systems of communication.

4 Fees for services conducted by visiting clergy because of a vacancy, holiday, sickness or any other cause, must be paid. From 1st January, the fees for a single Sunday service will rise from £30 to **£40**. Additional services will remain at **£15**. Travel expenses must always be paid at the standard rate of **45p** per mile.

Companion Dioceses Link Officer appointed

Mrs Pat Millar has been appointed by Bishop Nigel as Companion Dioceses Link Officer for the Diocese of Brechin. Pat will act as our key communicator and co-ordinate our relations with Swaziland and Iowa. Bishop Meshak's retirement and Bishop Alan's forthcoming visit here make 2012 an important time. Pat has been pro-active in both diocesan links and is known by many people. She will be gathering a small Companion Links Group for the work which we greatly value in this diocese.
