Bishop's Mornings

Bishop John writes -

This isn't about what I do in the mornings! but about what I hope to share with some congregations across the Diocese in the coming months.

Our congregations were not able to hear the important remarks I made at Synod about our Diocese's charges and their futures, and I was a bit disappointed that some of the 'reports on Synod' that appeared in Church magazines, made absolutely no mention of the critical things I talked about.

The fact is that across our Diocese some charges are having great difficulty in making ends meet; funds are running low, and week by week the giving of the congregation is insufficient to pay the incumbent. I will not shirk what I believe is my duty to point out to congregations, the pastoral and ministerial consequences for congregations if this continues.

I have a hunch (I hope I can be proved wrong) that, in many charges, members of congregations are blissfully unaware of how serious things are; that in some charges the congregation cannot afford to pay their own incumbent without assistance from outside—assistance that will not now be guaranteed in the future.

I would like every charge to discuss these things; and it is for this reason I want to come among congregations to encourage them to expand their thinking, their mission, and their general outreach—as well as their giving.

At all these sessions there will be a chance for individual members to quiz the incumbent, members of the vestry who are present, and the Bishop. There is much that we can attempt to adapt and change and to create a new future for ourselves.
